CHASING THE DIVINE IN THE HOLY LAND Ruth Everhart Wm. B. Eerdmans Publishing Company (2012) 176 pages E-book available RP1601

Ruth Everhart jumped at the offer to travel to the Holy Land as one of several ministers taking part in a documentary about pilgrimage. Little did she know just how demanding and rewarding her transformation from Presbyterian minister, wife and mom to pilgrim would be. In these pages, she writes about her trip into the dust and beauty of Christianity's cradle.

I AM MALALA: The Girl Who Stood Up for Education and was Shot by the Taliban Malala Yousafzai Back Bay Books (2015) 368 pages E-book available RP1607

When the Taliban took control of the Swat Valley in Pakistan, one girl spoke out. Malala Yousafzai refused to be silenced and fought for her right to an education, almost paying the ultimate price.
